<p>This text has two purposes. The reader should be able to understand the exaggeration in a tall tale, as well as how people can work together to achieve their goals.</p>		<p>The organization of the text is moderately complex. The use of illustrations helps to support understanding. Since this is a tall tale, parts of the story may be difficult to predict.</p>	
Prior Knowledge Demands		Language Features	
<p>The text assumes prior knowledge with ice fishing. Also, some of the details in the story are realistic while others are not likely to happen. Students who don't have an understanding of ice fishing may have a difficult time distinguishing between the two.</p>		<p>The sentence structure is primarily simple and compound sentences. The language is mostly explicit and easy to understand. There are some Tier 3 vocabulary words that may be unfamiliar and subject-specific, but context clues are included to help with understanding.</p>	
Potential Reader/Task Challenges			
<p>The text is a tall tale about ice fishing. If the reader is not familiar with either ice fishing or characteristics of a tall tale, this text may be challenging. Many Tier 2/3 words may be overwhelming for struggling readers as they will need to use context clues to determine the meaning.</p>			
Big Takeaway			
<p>Readers should take away from the text that goals are easier to achieve if everyone works together, while understanding that tall tales are exaggerated stories with realistic components. (RL.3.2 – Recount stories, including fables, folktales, and myths from diverse cultures; determine the central message, lesson, or moral and explain how it is conveyed through key details in the text)</p>
