The graphics are drawn but clearly explain the text. Highly engaging with color. The graphics extend the meaning of the text, for example it demonstrates wiggles and how the abdomen shrinks. Diagrams have labels and there are facts about the butterflies in the back of the book.	
Prior Knowledge Demands		Language Features	
Basic knowledge about a butterfly as part of the insect family and how it moves and lives would be helpful, but not necessary. The author is depicting the lifecycle so knowledge of a cycle would be helpful since that is how the book is set up. Discussion of nonfiction text features would be needed to enhance comprehension of the information.		Vocabulary uses scientific terms for the students. The sentence structure is short which helps the student with the more complex vocabulary. The pictures help the student to understand the scientific terms. Bold labels help to identify important and content specific words.	
Potential Reader/Task Challenges			
In recent years, monarch butterflies have become increasingly endangered in our geographic location so students may not have as much prior knowledge about seeing them in the world. Scientific vocabulary will be challenging for students. If they are not familiar with reading diagrams and pictures, they will need to be taught how to read diagrams before reading text.			
Big Takeaway			
Use of text features and words come alive with the authors us of diagrams, bold print to demonstrate the beauty of the monarch butterfly and the wonder of migration. Literacy .RI.1.7 The illustrations and the details in the text enable to appreciate how animals in nature continue to survive through the magical process of metamorphosis.
